Why Train With Us?

In your teacher training year you will spend two thirds of your time in schools, irrespective of the type of training route you choose. We offer the School Direct route in partnership with the University of Middlesex or the University of Hertfordshire. This gives you the opportunity to choose and train in a school you like, and that likes and chooses you. Middlesex University over a PG Cert with QTS whilst the University of Hertfordshire offers a PGCE for Primary.

We only choose people we think have the qualities to be a good teacher, and we expect our trainees to choose us because they can see we provide a strong mentor support structure with rigorous standards.

What We're Looking For

Academic Credentials

However much we like you, if you don't have the following academic qualifications you will not be able to train with us:

- A relevant honours degree from a British university with a minimum 2.2 or equivalent overseas degree supported by a recent NARIC certificate.
- For Secondary, GCSE Maths and English at Grade C or higher or equivalent (supported by a recent NARIC certificate for overseas students)
- For Primary, GCSE Science at Grade C or higher. Hertfordshire University do not offer equivalencies however, Middlesex University does. Therefore, if you do not have GCSE's you can apply to train with Middlesex but you will need to produce evidence from NARIC that you have an equivalent qualification.

For GCSEs, an equivalent qualification from Equivalency Testing Ltd is also acceptable for Middlesex University, **but not any other provider**.

Overseas applicants - please note that your school qualification in **English** in particular may not be equivalent to the GCSE and this will be stated on any NARIC certificate. If not, you will have to either sit the GCSE English Language exam or take an equivalency test from Equivalency Testing Ltd.









Personal Attributes

Above all else we want to see that you like and can interact appropriately with children and young people. We want to see that you:

- like people and can interact with them appropriately
- are determined, trustworthy and resilient
- show patience and kindness to others, and don't harbour grudges
- can engage peoples' attention, and adapt to situations as they unfold

You will also need to see teaching as a positive career choice and be interested in and informed about education in England today.

You need to be very clear about why you want to become a teacher, the skills involved and what you can bring to the profession.

School Experience

You will need to demonstrate 10 days' recent experience in a school (not as a pupil) in the age group you want to teach. We offer school experience days within our alliance schools for prospective applicants. To arrange school experience please request this by emailing a.phillips@londonacademy.org.uk.

Professional Skills Tests

You will need to pass the skills tests in literacy and numeracy. To prepare for and book your tests, visit the DFE's website at: http://sta.education.gov.uk/ (you won't be able to book your tests until you have applied for a course).

Other

You must also complete a satisfactory Enhanced DBS check, submit a health questionnaire and complete a placement form. Further details will be sent to you once you receive an offer.

How We Select Our Trainees

Selection

Schools will shortlist applicants for interview, with no fixed deadline. We may go through this process more than once for any particular programme.

Interviews

If selected you will be required to attend an interview at the school running the programme you have applied for, or attend a joint interview day co-hosted by several schools.

If you are applying to teach in secondary schools, you may have a second interview with our university partner, depending on the qualification you are obtaining.

Notification

If you are selected for interview we will upload the interview date to UCAS. You should be aware that UCAS will not automatically notify you if an interview date has been uploaded, so it is your responsibility to check the UCAS site regularly.









We will also contact you about the interview by email; please ensure that you also regularly check your spam folder. The interview email will ask you to confirm your attendance at the interview and the relevant email address will be supplied.

Offers are uploaded to UCAS and candidates are notified of this by email.
